The Potential Side Effects of Invokana

Beyond these potential side effects that could arise from taking Invokana, people have experienced lower limb amputation as a result of being administered the prescription medication.

According to studies, the rate of amputation in patients taking a placebo were 2.8 for every 1,000 patients. When given 100 mg of canagliflozin, the rate of lower limb amputation rose to 6.2 per 1,000, and the rate of amputation was 5.5 per 1,000 for those patients taking 300 mg of the drug.
