To Be Aware Of in June 2018

1 Keyera Energy Propane Gas

The problem with the Keyera Energy propane gas that you may have received is that there were 1.7 million gallons of propane that did not have enough odorant added. It's the odorant that alerts people to a gas leak. If you purchased this brand of propane, email propane@keyera.com to discuss your options.

2 GE LED Tube Lamps

These lamps were sold exclusively at Lowe's. The end of the tube lamp can be energized when it should be, posing the risk of shock and electrocution to the consumer. Do not change out your lamps before switching the light switch to "off". You can contact lightingconcerns@ge.com for more information about obtaining a refund.

3 VCB2 Circuit Board

There are switches on the board that can get caught in a sort of in-between position, causing them to overheat. This poses a burn hazard to consumers. The boards can be returned to Vernier for a free repair. The company will be reaching out to known consumers directly, but you can also visit www.vernier.com for more information.

4 Amerisun Snow Blowers

If you purchased a snow blower from Amerisun, you may want to see if it's part of the recall. There were close to 35,000 units sold in the United States. There is a pulley bolt on the machine that may become loose, causing the blower to be stuck in drive. Email support@amerisuninc.com or call (800) 791-9458 for more information.

5 Ketra Recessed Downlights

Downlights manufactured by Ketra have been recalled due to incorrect wiring in some units. The company is offering a free inspection of certain lights and, if necessary, repairs. A warning has been issued to consumers against inspecting the wiring themselves. Visit www.Ketra.com or call (800) 940-5917 for more information.

6 A&I Tractor Canopies

Tractor canopies manufactured by A&I are being recalled. Some units can cause the Rollover Protective Structure of a John Deere tractor to fail. This means that a driver could be injured should the tractor be involved in an accident. Visit www.aiproducts.com for more information about the recall, including getting a free repair from John Deere.

7 Uttermost Wall Decor Hardware

The hanging hardware from Uttermost can fail, causing a safety risk to anyone nearby. There were approximately 17,000 pieces sold. You can email owelch@uttermost.com to see if you need a replacement j-hook for your wall decor.

8 Ashley Furniture Floor Lamps

Incorrect labeling on the lamps tells consumers that they can use a 40 watt light bulb in the lamp when they should only be using a 25 watt bulb. This poses a burn hazard to users. Call (800) 477-2222 to find out if your lamp is part of the recall.
